Believe it or not, we are not only supposed to encounter it ourselves, but we are to deploy it point first towards our brethren with the intent of teaching and admonishing each other along the journey.

Colossians 3:16 *Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.*

While it is advisable to stay in the car when lions, tigers, and bears are around, scripture actually tells us to get out of the car when it comes to God's word! While powerful and potentially painful, it is not a life taker. It is a life giver. **Psalm 119:37** *Turn my eyes from looking at worthless things; and give me life in your ways.*

Without the Word of God, we can find ourselves making our own justifications for what we want to do. On the other hand, if we courageously put ourselves within striking distance of the Word, it will purge our motives and justifications from seeking our own will and lead us to LIFE IN HIS WAYS.
